# **Wound care**

- Thin pieces of tape (steri-strips) are used to cover and support your wounds.
   These should be kept dry if possible and not removed for 10 days.
- This will give you the best possible scar.
  Do not worry if they are a little dirty or
  have some dry blood on, underneath the
  tissues will be healing in the best
  environment. If you have any concerns
  with your wounds, contact any of the
  above numbers.

#### **Drain Care**

The Breast Link Nurse Specialist or District Nurse will visit

If your drain leaks or falls out- please:

- do not panic
- Do Not attended A&E or contact your GP, this is not an emergency.
- Place the dressing provided (in your dressing pack) over the drain site as advised and a Nurse will visit the following day.

#### Seroma

Sometimes, after the removal of your drain, a pocket of fluid called a seroma can collect under your chest wall or arm. If this happens, this is normal.

Contact your Breast Care Nurse, who will arrange for you to have it drained if needed. It is a very simple procedure, and you will not have to stay in hospital afterwards.

- Free prescriptions- Following your cancer diagnosis, you are eligible for free prescriptions. The FP29A form will be available from you GP.
- Free car parking- For all cancer related hospital appointments.
- Aintree Retreat (pamper day) is held every Tuesday for patients receiving treatment (ask your breast specialist nurse for booking and further details).
- Support Groups- The Sunshine support group is held by the Breast Nurse Specialist Team alternate months (evenings).

This service provides support for patients who have had a breast cancer diagnosis, opportunity to meet new people.

Regular social events are organised throughout the year, guest speakers such as holistic therapists, surgeons, specialist post-surgery lingerie consultants.

We appreciate that this is a very difficult time for you and your family.
