Child to Adult Transition Information

Audiology Department- Aintree Hospital

You have attended an appointment today to discuss your transition from the paediatric audiology service to the adult service.

This information leaflet has been produced to give you some further information and advice on what services are available to young people with a hearing loss and changes to your treatment now that you have been transferred to Aintree University Hospital.

Changes to your hearing aid service

Repair appointments

Please use our drop off service at the Audiology department Aintree Hospital, Elective Care Centre. Bring your hearing aid to the Audiology department before 10.30am and collect it after 12 noon on the same day (Monday – Friday - excluding bank holidays).

Batteries

At your first appointment the Audiologist will give you a small battery card that you will need to bring when you need replacement batteries.

If you have a cochlear implant you need to request batteries from Manchester Royal infirmary: 0161 276 8079 (spares and repairs)

Follow up care

We recommend having your hearing aids serviced

- Six monthly if you have an ear mould.
- Four monthly if you have a slim tube, open fit earpiece
- Twelve monthly if you have a custom ear mould with a slim tube.

In the adult service we generally do not test your hearing annually, however this may depend upon the nature of your hearing loss.

We recommend that you contact us to arrange a reassessment should you feel that your hearing has changed.

It is also advisable to ensure you have regular eye tests at your opticians.
