Haemoglobinopathy

A haemoglobinopathy is a genetic disorder of the red blood cells. The red blood cells contain a substance called haemoglobin and its function is to carry oxygen around the body.

There are a number patients registered at this hospital with a red cell disorder or Haemoglobinopathy.

Most of the patients have Sickle Cell disease and a small number have Thalassaemia or less common haemoglobinopathies.
